This year, the NSCDA-NC's Florence Kidder Memorial Scholarship (FKMS) received a total of 106 applications. 31 of these made it to the statewide competition. Many of the finalists represent the top of their classes and have taken rigorous coursework. According to the FKMS Chairman Martha Alexander, this year's essays were especially strong and interesting, making it difficult to pick a winner and runner-up. Fortunately, the scholarship program received some additional, unexpected funding, making it possible to award third, fourth and fifth place winners.

Alexander and co-reader Helen Meyer read essays on Quakers, Puritans, Pilgrims, Moravians, Huguenots, Scots-Irish, Swiss, and even the French-Italian Waldensians (from Valdese,NC). Some students also wrote essays about a specific ancestor's immigration. The winning essays were those that Alexander and Meyer felt most thoroughly answered all of the questions posed in the prompt and that most properly documented sources of information throughout the essay.



They selected Railey Pitts as the first-place winner. She is from Glen Alpine in Burke County. Her application represents the "At-Large" Committee, as Burke County does not have a local Dames County Committee. She wrote a richly-detailed, nicely documented, and well-written essay about the Moravian immigration to America.
